Notes From The Editor

Inside you will find my report on the demonstration by club member Bob Smith. Bob turned a hanging lidded box. Since the Christmas competition is a hanging form, this demonstration may help in deciding what to turn.

You will also find a few pictures from the Dalmann Open Day. Based near Swindon, Dalmann have taken over from Styles and Bates. Their timber store is about



the same size as Yandles but they don't have the associated machinery, tools and accessories that you can find at Yandles.

I have included a summary of the AGM. Chris Grimshaw has joined the committee. There were only a few comments from the floor so hopefully, we are running the club as you like. As announced at the AGM, the AWGB are putting up their subscription to £24 per year. The club is not changing its subscription, so we will be collecting £29 from you during November and December.

Our next meeting is on November 5th, when club member Paddy Byrne will be our demonstrator.

The Hinckley Christmas light switch on, takes place on Friday November 22nd. Please bring in suitable pieces for the stall. Further details will be provided nearer the time.

Raffle prize donations for the Christmas Party on December 17th would also be welcome. Bob Smith has agreed to cater the event so we look forward to a good buffet meal. Don't forget your spinning tops and your hanging vessel for the competition.

Bob Smith 1/10/24 A Hanging Box Decoration

The Christmas challenge this year is a hanging vessel. In order to give members some inspiration, Bob demonstrated how to turn a hanging box with finial. Using Rowan Ash from his own garden, Bob had already turned it to round.



Bob mounted it between centres and turned a chucking tenon on the tail stock end. After mounting it in a chuck, Bob trued up the side with a spindle roughing gouge and trued up the end with a parting tool. He then cut a recess 10mm in from the edge.



Bob drilled a 10mm hole (size not important) down the centre, to a depth marked by tape on the drill bit.



Bob then hollowed out using a spindle gouge followed by a negative rake scraper to smooth the inside. Bob finished the inside and rim with a coat of sanding sealer (cheap, bought from motor factor) followed by friction polish and a coat of microcrystalline wax.

For the top of the box, Bob used Sapele. After turning a chucking spigot, he held it in chuck and trued up the face.



Bob measured the body recess with calipers and transferred the measurement to the top. He then cut a spigot to fit the main body. A few tries & resizes were necessary to achieve a good fit. He then cut the spigot deeper and ensured the matching face was square. After cutting the centre slightly concave, he decorated the spigot with three lines. He then sanded, sealed, and applied Friction polish and wax as before.



With the body back in the chuck, Bob fit the top and brought up the tail stock to hold. He turned the outside of the top to fit the body. He then tapered the top, as small as possible, with tail stock support and turned a short finial at the end. Bob said the finial can be different timber



Bob drilled through the end for a rope, so the top can lift off when still hanging. As before, he sanded, sealed and applied friction polish, followed by Microcrystalline wax. The top wants to be a loose fit, so it can be lifted off while still hanging.



Using the recess on the body, Bob remounted the body onto a chuck. He then curved the body down to about 20mm at the end. He made the end slightly concave. Bob drilled another hole through the end (same hole as top). He then drilled a larger hole 5mm deep, to take the knot of string. The larger hole will be hidden by the lower finial.



The lower finial was also Sapele. A spigot was turned to fit the larger hole and the outside diameter turned to fit the body. Bob burned several lines on the body for decoration.




